Class I, II and III railroad personnel, shippers, rail labor representatives, state and local government representatives, and members from the supplier community are all invited to participate. ASLRRA Members Asked to Review Hazmat Safety Manual

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) issued <u>safety</u> recommendation R-20-27 to ASLRRA, the Association of American Railroads and the Renewable Fuels Association as a result of the NTSB report "Placement of DOT-111 Tank Cars in High Hazard Flammable Trains and the Use of Buffer Cars for the Protection of Train Crews."

ASLRRA asks its railroad members to please review a manual produced by the <u>Alternative Fuels Association</u> titled <u>Best Practices for Rail Transport of Ethanol.</u> This manual is a comprehensive guide to tank cars moving hazardous materials and is a good review for railroads that move such materials.

TSA Document Answers Frequently Asked Questions Concerning Cybersecurity Directives

In order to offer clarification regarding Security Directives (SDs) 1580-21-01 and 1582-21-01, the Transportation Security Administration worked with its surface transportation partners to produce a <u>frequently asked questions (FAQ) document</u> for those to whom the directives apply.

The FAQs explain which freight railroad carriers are subject to the SDs and provide details regarding topics such as who can qualify as a company's cybersecurity coordinator, how to report a cybersecurity incident and how to implement a cybersecurity incident response plan. Congress Passes Another Funding Stopgap Bill

Funding for government operations expires on Feb. 18, and this week the House passed a continuing resolution that will ensure government operations continue through March 11. The legislation will be the third extension of federal funding Congress has passed, this latest one coming more than four months into the 2022 fiscal year.

The Senate is also likely to pass the measure in the coming days. Some lead congressional negotiators suggest with tepid optimism

that the short-term spending measure could provide enough time for a spending deal to be worked out for the rest of the fiscal year, which ends in September.

To achieve that, Congress will still need to overcome significant hurdles, including setting a topline level for the overall spending package and resolving differences on a number of thorny social policy matters. Many stakeholders are eager to see a long-term measure become law, as it will help ensure that the benefits of the new infrastructure law, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), are fully realized.

AAR Letter Calls for DOT to Ensure Grade Crossing Grants Program Is Streamlined, Efficient

As the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) begins implementing the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), one of the key new funding opportunities for freight rail will be the new grade crossing elimination program. The bill provides \$600 million annually in guaranteed spending for the new program over the next five years.

The Association of American Railroads (AAR) wrote a letter to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) last week urging the FRA to ensure the application review process – which has yet to begin – is minimally burdensome and ensures flexibility. View their letter here.

ASLRRA agrees that streamlining the application process for all the grants established or backed with increased funding in the IIJA will improve the supply chain and enable small business railroads to compete successfully for discretionary funding.

Staff Attends Chamber of Commerce Meeting In Person and Online

On Feb. 2, ASLRRA President Chuck Baker and Vice President of Government Affairs Tom Lynch attended the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Transportation Infrastructure and Logistics Committee meeting at the Chamber of Commerce headquarters in Washington, D.C. Two other members of ASLRRA's congressional affairs team, Zach Radford and Crystal Gitchell, attended the meeting virtually.

Among guests to present and attend were Polly Trottenberg, the deputy secretary at the U.S. Department of Transportation, who is a pivotal player in the rollout of the new Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). Trottenberg discussed the Biden administration's priorities in implementing the new law. Other guests to present included top Democratic and Republican staffers from the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee and the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee.

ASLRRA pressed the case with U.S. Department of Transportation and congressional representatives for making sure the IIJA is implemented swiftly and that key discretionary grant programs of importance to short line freight rail are funded to the maximum extent. Administration and congressional personnel and chamber staff also discussed a number of supply chain issues in-depth, and ASLRRA staff were eager to share how short line freight rail can be critical in alleviating congestion and bringing new efficiencies to the freight network.
