ASLRRA Seeks Clarification of FRA Emergency Order Requiring Face Masks

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) issued an <u>emergency</u> <u>order</u> (EO), effective March 1, requiring railroad personnel to wear a face mask while engaged in railroad operations. We have heard from

many of our members with concerns, asking for clarification on multiple aspects of the order.

As communicated originally via e-mail to all member primary contacts on Thursday, March 25 and with a follow-up on Friday, March 26, ASLRRA has compiled and submitted numerous questions for clarification to the FRA on behalf of our members.

Some of the questions submitted by ASLRRA concern mask-wearing requirements for railroad employees in office buildings, visitors to railroad property, socially distanced employees working outside and vaccinated employees. Other questions concern whether a railroad must supply face masks to its employees and more.

ASLRRA will widely share the FRA's responses and any other clarifying information once they are received.

The FRA has provided an e-mail to ask questions: <u>RailroadsMaskup@dot.gov</u>, but we encourage members to wait for FRA to answer the large number of pending questions from ASLRRA prior to submitting additional questions.

In the order, the FRA explains its reasoning, potential maximum consequences for non-compliance, lists of situations in which people are exempt from wearing masks, and people who are exempt from wearing masks.

Please check the U.S. Department of Transportation's (DOT) <u>FAQ Section</u> for additional information. Two items of particular note are:

- Following the question, "Does the mandate require mask wearing by railroad employees at all times or only when such employees cannot maintain social distance?" DOT states that "...a railroad employee who is the sole occupant of a vehicle, locomotive cab, or hi-rail truck, or a railroad employee performing duties **outdoors and not in proximity to any other persons** (e.g., a railroad employee performing a train or track inspection outdoors and far from any other persons), would have flexibility through company policy or employee discretion to choose not to wear a mask." (emphasis added)
- Additionally, DOT states on the FAQ page (as well as in the EO) that "per the CDC order, persons for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to workplace health, safety or job duty

as determined by the relevant workplace safety guidelines or federal regulations are not required to wear a mask."

NTSB Issues Safety Recommendation to ASLRRA Regarding 2018 Accident

The National Transportation Safety Board issued a <u>safety recommendation</u> to the ASLRRA on Jan. 25 addressing the <u>2018 collision</u> of two Union Pacific trains in Granite Canyon, Wyo.

The safety recommendation comprises two parts. First, conduct analysis of radio frequency propagation in grade territories over which short lines operate to identify areas where head-of-train device and end-of-train device communication may be lost. Second, we recommend that your railroad ensure continuous head-of-train device and end-of-train device communication.

If you have areas within your territory that may be susceptible to communication loss, please mitigate the issue and check your radio transmission activity frequently. If you have questions please contact ASLRRA's <u>Jo Strang</u> or <u>JR Gelnar</u>.

North Carolina DOT Accepting Applications for Short Line Projects

The North Carolina Department of Transportation is <u>accepting</u> <u>applications</u> for its Short Line Infrastructure Assistance Program, which offers grant funding for infrastructure improvements.

The matching grants will be awarded as part of the Freight Rail and Rail Crossing Safety Improvement program, which supports rail infrastructure health, safety and performance.

Grant applications are due March 26, and can be submitted through the state's Partner Connect site.

ASLRRA's <u>Member Discount Program</u> features grant-writing Preferred Providers who can help members prepare and submit grant applications.

Other programs currently soliciting grant applications are the federal <u>Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) Program</u>, due March 19, and the New York State Department of Transportation's <u>Passenger and Freight Rail Assistance Program and Railway-Highway Grade Crossing Program</u>. New York grant <u>applications</u> are due April 22.

RRB Q&A Reports on Agency's Service Standards

The Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) is meeting its Customer Service Plan performance goals 99 percent of the time according to the most <u>recent edition</u> of its question-and-answer series.

Each year, the RRB evaluates how well it met the standards outlined in its <u>Customer Service Plan</u>. The plan reflects principles of quality public service, such as accessibility, accountability and timeliness standards.

According to the report, the RRB's overall timeliness index during fiscal year 2020 was 99 percent, meaning the RRB provided benefit services aligned to Customer Service Plan standards 99 percent of the time. The report further breaks down timeliness for different categories, including processing different benefits applications.

SOFA Working Group Releases Safety Brief Discussing Industry Hazards

The Federal Railroad Administration's (FRA) Switching Operations Fatality Analysis (SOFA) Working Group has released its quarterly Safety Brief, which discusses industry hazards.

The brief defines industry hazards, identifies some conditions that can lead to these hazards, and offers tips to help employees identify and avoid such situations.

Baker Quoted in Announcement of Bill to Improve RRIF Program

Senators John Thune (R-S.D.) and Maggie Hassan (D-N.H.) reintroduced a bill that would improve the Railroad Rehabilitation and Improvement Financing (RRIF) loan program.

ASLRRA President Chuck Baker was featured in a press release from Thune's office announcing the bill.

"This legislation would improve the RRIF program and make it more viable for short lines," said Baker. "It addresses several important issues that have been hurdles to participation in the RRIF program for our short line members, including some solutions that are being piloted in the RRIF Express program."

The <u>Railroad Rehabilitation and Financing Innovation Act</u> would provide dedicated funding for RRIF financing costs, streamline the application process and extend loan terms for certain assets.


