## ASLRRA Eager to Provide Input on American Jobs Plan

On March 31, President Biden unveiled his <u>American Jobs Plan</u> in a speech in Pittsburgh. In a response to the proposal, ASLRRA President Chuck Baker welcomed Biden's plan and underscored the willingness of ASLRRA to work with the administration and lawmakers on behalf of short line railroads.

"The ASLRRA and the nation's 600+ small business short line freight railroads welcome the President's infrastructure proposal, the

American Jobs Plan," said Baker. "Short lines are a critical part of the nation's infrastructure, driving economic growth across the country, as we serve thousands of shippers in the critical manufacturing, agriculture, and energy industries, and thousands of communities, particularly in small town and rural America."

"We look forward to working with the Administration and Congress in a bipartisan way as they develop and consider this proposal. Short lines can help accomplish many of the nation's most important goals, such as economic development, jobs growth, safety, and environmental sustainability, and we will look to help steer this plan in a way that recognizes and prioritizes those possibilities."

The plan calls for billions of dollars to be spent on improving U.S. transportation networks, including \$80 billion for rail. This funding would be used, in part, to enhance grant and loan programs for passenger and freight rail.

## Attend Pre-Railroad Day Training Meeting, LRW to Hold Networking Event After Railroad Day

The first <u>Railroad Day on Capitol Hill</u> informational Zoom meeting was held yesterday, allowing registered participants to test their computer set ups, review key talking points and understand anticipated meeting flow.

Another informational call will be held tomorrow, April 8, at 12:30 EDT. Participants will receive a reminder e-mail with the Zoom link and are encouraged to attend, or view a recording of the call, which will be available after April 8.

Railroad Day organizers are finalizing the hundreds of anticipated meetings for railroad industry employees and stakeholders, working to place participants in meetings most relevant to their interests. Railroad Day serves as the single most effective way to deliver the rail industry message to Congress, with a large number of geographically diverse attendees allowing lawmakers to meet those most affected by their policies and decisions.

### SLSI Safety Tip Reviews When Equipment is in the Clear

A new <u>safety tip</u> from the Short Line Safety Institute (SLSI) reviews when rolling stock and on-track maintenance equipment is in the clear.

The document references 49 CFR Section 218.101 and reviews exceptions to fouling a connecting track and identifying clearance points. There are also discussion questions for use during safety briefings.
