# **Federal Grant Application Due Dates Loom**

A number of grant programs provided by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) have opened for applications, and ASLRRA urges short line railroads to partner with eligible entities to apply!

- April 14 RAISE Grants (\$1.5 billion)
- May 16 PIDP Grants (\$450 million)
- May 23 MPDG Grants (\$2.9 billion for three programs)

The first due date for these federal programs is April 14 for <u>RAISE grants</u>. These grants can be used for a variety of projects and ASLRRA railroad members can partner with an eligible entity to apply. At least \$15 million of the \$1.5 billion available will go to projects in Areas of Persistent Poverty or Historically Disadvantaged Communities. A new <u>tool</u> created by the DOT helps applicants identify whether their project is located in one of these areas.

A month later, on May 16, the Maritime Administration's <u>Port Infrastructure Development Program</u> (<u>PIDP</u>) <u>grants</u> are due. Projects to improve facilities that support U.S. port operations, including railroad infrastructure, are eligible.

Then, on May 23, Multimodal Projects Discretionary Grant (MPDG) applications are due. The MPDG opportunity provides one application for three grant programs, the National Infrastructure Project Assistance (MEGA) program, the Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program (RURAL) and the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) program. The MEGA, RURAL and INFRA grants share many of the same goals, and many of the same factors and criteria are taken into consideration in awarding funds.

The DOT is offering webinars for each of these three programs, with advice on how to apply and how to prepare a benefit-cost analysis. All webinars are free and will be recorded and posted for later viewing. There are also webinars geared toward helping tribal and rural applicants and those with projects in disadvantaged communities. The next live webinar, which takes place on March 31, discusses how to apply for MPDG grants.

#### **TSA Information Circular Offers Cybersecurity Recommendations**

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) <u>issued</u> <u>recommendations</u> to surface transportation operators regarding the increased cybersecurity threat posed by Russian actors.

The recommended measures include reviewing and implementing, as appropriate, actions outlined in the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's (CISA) <u>alert concerning satellite communication networks</u> (SATCOM), as well as an <u>alert regarding</u>

ways attacks exploit vulnerabilities to access networks.

TSA stresses that while they advise organizations to take up these measures, these recommendations are offered as guidance and do not replace any federal statues or requirements.

#### Comments by ASLRRA and Others Oppose EPA's Tentative Response to Regulatory Amendment Petition

ASLRRA joined the Association of American Railroads (AAR) in <u>filing comments</u> with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in response to the agency's <u>notice of tentative response</u> to the associations' petition for changes to be made to the Non-Hazardous Secondary Materials (NHSM) regulations. The EPA is proposing to deny the requested amendments.

ASLRRA, AAR, the American Forest and Paper Association (AF&PA), the Treated Wood Council (TWC) and the American Wood Council (AWC) petitioned the EPA in 2018 to change restrictions on creosote-treated railroad ties (CTRTs) and other paper recycling residuals that can be burned as non-waste fuel. The EPA's January 2022 proposal to deny these requests prompted ASLRRA and AAR's comments, which oppose the EPA's decision and ask the agency to reconsider.

The associations argue the EPA's decision runs counter to its stated goal of lowering greenhouse gas emissions, reducing the amount of waste sent to landfills and replacing fossil fuels with biofuels like CTRTs. Every year U.S. railroads must replace approximately 23 million wooden crossties, and the EPA's restriction on burning them as fuel for energy has resulted on an increased number being sent to landfills.

In addition to its comments, ASLRRA submitted <u>Attachment A</u> and <u>Attachment B</u> with the results of a study on whether CTRTs contain levels of hazardous air pollutants higher than would be found in traditional liquid fuels. The study found CTRTs to have levels of pollutants consistently lower than or roughly equal to traditional fuels.

ASLRRA and AAR were also included on comments in opposition to the EPA's proposed denial submitted by AF&PA, TWC and AWC.

#### RRB Examines Retirement Age Reductions in March Q&A

The Railroad Retirement Board (RRB) released the <u>March edition</u> of its question and answer (Q&A) series, focused this month on railroad retirement age reductions.

The Q&A explains how to determine full retirement age and includes annuity reduction percentages for employees with less than 30 years of service who retire before reaching full retirement age. Also discussed are how these rules apply to spouse benefits, disability annuities and survivor benefits.



## Biden Administration Releases FY 2023 Budget Proposal

Monday was Budget Day in Washington, D.C., with the White House releasing its proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2023, which begins Oct. 1, 2022. The proposal includes significant transportation funding, including nearly \$18 billion for passenger and freight programs – a close to \$15 billion increase from two years ago.

Highlights for programs of most interest to the short line freight rail industry include:

- \$500 million for the Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements program (CRISI)
- \$245 million for the new grade crossing elimination grant program
- \$1.5 billion for "National Infrastructure Investments," which appears to include the Local and Regional Project Assistance Program (RAISE) and National Infrastructure Project Assistance Program (MEGA)
- \$230 million for the Port Infrastructure Development program
- \$58 million for the Federal Railroad Administration's Research and Development and \$254 million for FRA's Safety and Operations

ASLRRA's government affairs team will continue to keep tabs on the many forthcoming documents for noteworthy items for short lines and will work with lawmakers and administration officials in these next months to ensure the priorities of the Association's members are reflected in discussions, drafts and, ultimately, law.
