ASLRRA Calls on President Biden to Quickly Appoint Emergency Board to Settle Rail Labor Negotiations

ASLRRA President Chuck Baker joins with others in calling for the appointment of a Presidential Emergency Board (PEB) to conduct hearings and issue settlement recommendations to help bring an expedited end to stalled labor talks.

In a <u>letter</u> to President Joe Biden, Baker notes that although only a few short lines are directly represented by the National Carriers' Conference Committee, effectively all traffic moved by short line railroads moves over a Class I railroad at some point on its journey from origin to destination. As the U.S. freight rail network is completely interconnected, ASLRRA's members and customers will be impacted by the resolution of this matter.

Baker urges the swift appointment of accredited and impartial arbiters with rail expertise to ensure a positive, credible outcome to the process.

FRA Releases Rail Crossing Elimination Grant Funding Notice

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Railroad Administration released a <u>notice of funding opportunity (NOFO)</u> for the <u>Railroad Crossing Elimination (RCE) Program</u>. It is a new competitive discretionary grant program providing over \$573 million to improve grade crossing safety across the U.S.

The program will fund projects to create grade separations, close or relocate crossings, improve or install warning devices at crossings as part of separation or relocation projects, and more. Funding can also be used for planning and preliminary design efforts.

Short line railroads are not directly eligible for RCE grants, but ASLRRA encourages members interested in pursuing funding for a particular grade separation project to coordinate with an eligible public entity applicant. Applications are due Oct. 4.

Jake Safety Award Winners Can Access Certificates Online

Each of this year's <u>Jake Award</u> winners can now use <u>this link</u> to download and print their award certificate to display in the workplace. Last week, ASLRRA <u>announced</u> the winners of its annual Jake Awards, honoring a record 364 member railroads for their above-industry-average safety record during 2021.

For the second year in a row, the number of railroads earning Jake Awards with Distinction also set a record. Ninety-one percent, or 332, of all award winners had zero reportable injuries for the entire year.

ASLRRA also recognized 20 members as President's Award winners. These railroads are Jake Award recipients posting the lowest reportable injury frequency rate per Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) regulations measured within person-hour categories. There is one winner per person-hour category in each of ASLRRA's member regions, Central, Eastern, Pacific and Southern. ASLRRA will recognize the President's Award winners at this year's Regional Meetings in the fall.

RRB Q&A Discusses Unemployment and Sickness Benefits

A new benefit year began July 1 for benefits under the Railroad Unemployment Insurance Act, so the latest <u>Railroad Retirement</u> <u>Board (RRB) Question and Answer (Q&A)</u> focuses on unemployment and sickness benefits.

The RRB explains the most current eligibility requirements and daily benefit rates payable for both unemployment and sickness benefits in the new year. Also included are explanations of circumstances that might affect employees' ability to collect benefits and how an individual can apply for and claim both types of benefits.



Full House Committee Passes Draft Spending Bill for FY23

On June 30 the full House appropriations committee passed a proposed fiscal year 2023 transportation spending bill, with several items beneficial to the short line freight rail industry.

Aside from the significant increase in funding for Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) Grant Program, other grant programs received funds in addition to what was

allotted in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), namely RAISE grants and Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP) grants. Absent from the bill is language concerning truck size and weight increases, which is a win for freight rail.

ASLRRA's Government Affairs team continues to monitor this bill and others that contain provisions that could impact short line railroads and freight rail in general. There were such issues in both the Energy and Water spending bill and the Commerce, Justice and Science (CJS) spending bill, specifically funding for new locomotive technologies in the former and language focused on passenger rail service and cracking down on train cargo theft in the latter.

The transportation spending bill and other spending measures are expected to be considered by the full House of Representatives in the coming weeks.


