ASLRRA Honors Record Number of Member Railroads for Safety Performance *Jake Award Recognizes 364 Railroads for Above Industry-Average Safety Performance in 2021*WASHINGTON – June 29, 2022 – The American Short Line and Regional Railroad Association (ASLRRA) today awarded a record number of <u>Jake Safety Awards</u>, including twenty member railroads being recognized as <u>President's Safety Award</u> winners. The Jake Award program recognizes member railroads for above-industry average safety performance during 2021. Of the 364 <u>Jake Award recipients</u>, 332 member railroads will be honored "<u>with Distinction"</u> recognizing their FRA reportable injury-free performance in 2021. For the second year in a row, a record number of railroads earned 'with Distinction' honors - 332 vs. 316 in 2020 and 278 in 2019.

"The railroad industry is safe, and getting safer. Our short line members are doing their part to continue to drive those statistics in the right direction, placing safety above all competing priorities," said Chuck Baker, President of ASLRRA. "The short line industry average safety incident rate has dropped once again to 2.17 reportable incidents per 200,000 person-hours worked. 364 of our member railroads performed at or above the industry average, a 5% increase from 2020's list of 346 railroads. In addition, 91% of Jake Award recipients had zero reportable injuries, noted as Jake Awards with Distinction."

To be honored with a Jake Award, an ASLRRA member must perform better than the industry average reportable injury frequency rate for railroads other than Class Is, commuter railroads and Amtrak based on data reported to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) during the calendar year and must have completed all FRA-required Employee-On-Duty reporting for 2021.

Twenty ASLRRA members are President's Award Winners, designated as a Jake Award recipient that posts the lowest reportable injury frequency rate per Federal Railroad Administration regulations as measured within person-hour categories. The awards will be presented at the 2022 ASLRRA Regional Meetings held this fall.

The Jake Awards are named for the late Lowell S. "Jake" Jacobson, the President and General Manager of the Copper Basin Railway. After achieving a perfect safety record for the CBRY in 1993, Jake realized that there was no award that recognized smaller railroads' safety records. In 1999, the ASLRRA Safety Committee adopted the Jake Awards, and since then, has continued Mr. Jacobson's legacy of rewarding and drawing attention to the high safety standards of the small railroad industry.

Since its inception in 1995, the Jake Award program has distributed nearly 6,600 Jake and Jake with Distinction Awards to America's small railroad community.
