Justin Broyles Succeeds Matt Walsh as Chairman of the ASLRRRA

WASHINGTON – April 27, 2026 The American Short Line and Regional Railroad Association (ASLRRRA) has announced that Justin Broyles, President and CEO, R.J. Corman, has assumed the role of Chairman of the ASLRRRA Board of Directors, succeeding Matt Walsh. Walsh, Executive Vice President of Global Corporate Development at Genesee & Wyoming Railroad Services Inc. has served as Chairman for three years and fulfilled his term.
